


Liz provided some important detail around the arrest in front of Parkhurst and other subjects too, ie. Tuck ahead of Stanford in the US News Poll.



Dean of Students Scott Brown - I know he's spoken before but I always like to hear from him. In fact, it might make sense to have him on a regular rotation.

Speakers involved in current programs/departments/issues at the College to give attendees a better understanding of them. Having a schedule in advance over the course of months with different topics as suggested in the previous sentence would be useful for planning purposes etc.
